## THE HYMNS

Come, ye thankful people, come was written by Henry Alford, D.D. (1810-1871). Educated at Cambridge, he was Dean of Canterbury Cathedral from 1857 to his death. He was a poet, painter, musician and preacher. He was also a great writer and known for his commentary on the Greek New Testament.

Through all the changing scenes of life was written by Nathum Tate (1652-1715) and Nicholas Brady (1659-1726). Tate was educated in Dublin and Poet Laureate in 1692 and Historiographer in 1702. He was a playwright, adapting works of others. He died in a sanctuary for debtors. Bady was educated at Christ Church, Oxford and Trinity, Dublin. He became rector of Stratford-on-Avon (1702-1705) and later of Clapham, South London.

*Thy Kingdom come, O God* was written by Lewis Hensley (1824-1905). He was educated at Trintiy, Cambridge, and made a Fellow there (1846-181852). He became Vicar of Hitchen in 1856 and Canon of St. Albans in 1881.

We plough the fields and scatter was written by Matthias Claudius (1740-1815) and translated by Jane Montgomery Campbell (1817-1878). It is a translation of a peasants' song and is the description of a harvest thanksgiving party in a German farmhouse. Claudius was jovial and a jester and lover of nature. Although poverty-stricken, he and his wife had a happy life and 11 children. Miss Campbell was daughter of the rector of St. James', Paddington, London. She taught singing.


